From 23 to 24 March 2015 the Max Planck Foundation for International Peace and the Rule of Law (MPFPR) in Heidelberg, Germany, in collaboration with the Development and Rule of Law Programme (DROP) at the Faculty of Law, University of Stellenbosch, South Africa and the Southern African Political Economy Series (SAPES) Trust in Harare, Zimbabwe is organising a conference on “Assessing Progress in the Implementation of Zimbabwe’s New Constitution: National, Regional and Global Perspectives”.

The conference will focus on the chances and challenges deriving from the provisions and the implementation process of Zimbabwe’s new Constitution. It aims to initiate a dialogue between policy makers, members of the judiciary, civil society organizations and other constitutional experts about progress made and further necessary steps to improve the state of implementation of the 2013 Constitution.

The conference will bring together key stakeholders in the Zimbabwean constitutional process and experts from South Africa, Tanzania, Zambia and Germany to discuss various aspects of the 2013 Zimbabwean Constitution. The focus will be on the current system in Zimbabwe with comparative constitutional perspectives to encourage and cross-fertilize the discourse.
